Funding decisions will be announced in January 2027 and May 2027, respectively.

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About the Knowledge Foundation

The Knowledge Foundation is a funder with the mission to strengthen Sweden's competitiveness. The foundation funds research and competence development at Sweden's university colleges and newer universities when it takes place in collaboration with the business sector. The Foundation's calls are open to all scientific and artistic subject areas.

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The programme Capacity Building¹

Solving future societal challenges requires both cutting-edge research results and a higher education of high quality. To achieve this, Sweden's universities and university colleges (henceforth called universities in the call text) need to be able to strategically recruit or adjunct relevant key competences. Mobility of researchers and teachers between universities and sectors, both nationally and internationally, is a quality-driving factor that contributes to development and strengthened competitiveness in the long run. The Knowledge Foundation therefore offers funding through the programme *Capacity building* to facilitate universities in recruiting international guest researcher or adjunct professor/senior lecturer with placement at a university or at a business partner.

Objectives and purpose of the programme

The objective of the programme *Capacity building* is to promote mobility as well as to strengthen and develop the capacity of the applicant research and education environment for research and education relevant to the business sector.

- The objective of recruiting an international guest researcher is to establish or deepen collaboration with a strategically important international academic environment and/or to establish new international contacts and networks.
- The objective of recruiting an adjunct professor/lecturer is to establish or deepen collaboration with a strategically important business actor, as well as to exchange knowledge and competence between the academic environment and the business sector.

The purpose of the programme is to enable research and education environments to strengthen the quality of their research and education through new and deepened collaborations. The purpose is also to contribute to benefits to the business sector through increased exchange of knowledge and competence between academia and industry.

Project design

The programme offers funding for the employment/appointment of international guest researcher or adjunct professor/lecturer with placement at a university or at a business partner.

International guest researcher

For the employment/appointment of international guest researcher, the following applies

- the intended person must be identified at the time of application
- the guest researcher must be employed by a university outside Sweden
- the intended person must not previously have been affiliated, employed, or otherwise engaged at the applicant university
- the guest researcher must have a doctoral degree² and hold an employment at least equivalent to the level of senior lecturer
- the employment/appointment and the recruitment process must meet the requirements of the university's appointments procedure
- any peer review of the intended person may be performed after the Knowledge Foundation has rendered a positive decision.

Adjunct positions

For the employment/appointment of an adjunct professor/senior lecturer with placement at a university or at a business partner, the following applies

- the intended person must be identified at the time of application
- the employment/appointment and recruitment process must meet the requirements of the university's appointments procedure (applies to adjunct professor/senior lecturer with a placement at a university)
- for adjunct positions with a placement at a business partner, only professors and senior lecturers employed by the applicant university may be considered
- adjunct professor/senior lecturer may not be from or to companies of sole proprietorship
- any peer review of the intended person may be performed after the Knowledge Foundation has rendered a positive decision.

Terms and conditions**Applicants**

Sweden's university colleges and newer universities³ may apply. The Knowledge Foundation welcomes applications within all subject areas. When the application concerns an artistic research domain, the concept *scientific* is to be replaced by *artistic* in the call text.

Participation of the university

The project must have a project manager who is operationally responsible for the implementation of the project. The project manager should have a doctoral degree⁴ and be employed by the university at the latest at the start of the project. At the university, there must also be an appointed project owner. The project owner, who must have staff and budget authority at a senior level at the university, is responsible for ensuring proper conditions for the implementation of the project, and for monitoring the implementation. The project owner should have the right of delegation to conclude agreements with the Knowledge Foundation. The project manager and the project owner should not be the same

person. For projects that involve the employment/appointment of an adjunct professor/senior lecturer, the intended person cannot be project manager or project owner.

For the employment forms international guest researcher and adjunct professor/senior lecturer from the business sector to a university, the university must co-finance the project with direct funds equivalent to at least 10 percent of the amount requested from the Foundation (read more under *Financial framework and budgeting*). The contributions of the university must be clearly stated in the project plan and budget. Please note that overhead costs can not to be included in the co-financing from the university.

Participation of the business sector and other partners

The project must be conducted in co-production with the business sector. For more information on the Foundation's view on co-production, go to [the Foundation's website](#)⁵.

For the employment form adjunct professor/senior lecturer from a university to the business sector, at least one business actor must co-finance the project with the equivalent of at least 10 percent of the amount requested from the Foundation (read more under *Financial framework and budgeting*). Clarification of the criteria for co-financing business actors can be found on [the Foundation's website](#)⁶. All co-financing business actors must attach signed letters of intent describing expected results and benefits of the participation, as well as how the co-operation in the project will take place. The letters of intent must also clearly describe the organisation's financial and resource conditions for meeting the obligations described in the project plan and budget.

For the employment forms international guest researcher and adjunct professor/senior lecturer from the business sector to a university, where co-financing from the business sector is not a requirement, all kinds of partners are welcome to participate in the project.⁷ These participating partners bear their own costs related to the project but should also attach signed letters of intent where the contributions to the project are described and motivated. The suitability and relevance of the partners for the project, as well as the forms of participation will be assessed based on the assessment criteria *Benefit to the business sector*.

Any connections, such as financial or personal links, between for example participating partners, between any partner and university, or between any partner and individual project participant(s), must be stated and clarified in the application form and the project plan. Any potential dual roles must be clarified and will be subject to review by the Knowledge Foundation. Specify, for example, company connections, share ownership, board positions, employment, or consulting activities.

Project duration

See under the section *Project design* for information about project duration for each employment form.

The project period starts the day the international guest researcher or the adjunct professor/senior lecturer begins the employment/appointment at the university/business actor.

For applications submitted no later than 13 October 2026: Projects may start no earlier than 1 February 2027, and no later than 1 February 2028.

For applications submitted no later than 28 January 2027: Projects may start no earlier than 1 August 2027, and no later than 1 August 2028.

Financial framework and budgeting

The programme offers funding for the employment/appointment of international guest researcher, or adjunct professors/lecturers with placement at a university or at a business partner. The amounts to be requested from the Knowledge Foundation are stated in tables below.

The funds from the Foundation as well as the co-financing from the university and/or business partner should primarily be used for salary costs related to working hours within the project for the international guest researcher or the adjunct professor/senior lecturer. Funding may, to a limited extent, also be used to cover salary costs for other project participants. In addition to salary costs, other direct costs arising within the project at the applying university can be included in the budget. Teaching activities at undergraduate level (first cycle) cannot be funded by the Knowledge Foundation.

Adjunct professor/senior lecturer from a university to the business sector	800,000 SEK	Business actors must co-finance the project with the equivalent of at least 10 percent of the amount requested from the Foundation.

An OH surcharge of 20 percent will be added by the Foundation if the application is granted. Please also note that accommodation costs are not approved costs and must therefore not be included in the budget.

Application

The application should be submitted via the project manager's account in the Knowledge Foundation's application system *SBS Manager* via [the Foundation's website](#)⁹. Supplementing the application after the closing date of the call is not possible.

Please enter the project title in the application form with the *employment form* and *subject area*, for example '*International guest researcher in Building Production*' or '*Adjunct professor in Art History*'.

Appendices to the application

The following appendices (as PDF files) should be attached to the application in the same order as below. The structure of the appendices must follow the headings specified for each appendix. Under each heading, the main characteristics of the information that the Foundation expects are stated. However, applicants may provide supplementary information that is deemed appropriate based on the direction of the call.

The application may be written in Swedish or in English. Note that all body text in Appendices 1 and 2 must follow the format font Arial, font size 11 pt, single line spacing, and standard margins (2,5 cm on all sides).

Appendix 1. The project's contribution to the development of the research and education environment

Maximum 2 pages. If a project is applied for jointly by several research and education environments, all environments must be described according to the instructions below (the appendix may be extended by a maximum of half a page per additional environment). To be uploaded under *Appendix 1. The project's contribution to the research and education environment(s)*.

All the Knowledge Foundation's programmes contribute in different ways to supporting the development of strong research and education environments that create value for academia, the business sector, and society. Therefore, all projects applied for must be situated within a context in which they contribute to strengthening the development and profile of the research and education environment. In this way, the environment can also become a long-term and valuable partner for the business sector. For more information on what the Knowledge Foundation means by strong research and education environments, and how such an environment can be defined, go to [the Foundation's website](#)¹⁰.

This appendix should be based on the group (research and education environment) within which the project will be conducted and should be prepared jointly by the management of the research and education environment and the project manager.

1.1. The research and education environment where the project will be conducted

Briefly describe the research and education environment in which the project will be conducted. Tailor the description to what is most relevant in relation to the programme and the project.

1.2. The project's contribution to the development of the research and education environment

Describe the ambitions and objectives of the research and education environment for becoming a stronger environment. Justify how the project will contribute to the environment's desired development in the short and long term. Also describe in what way the project adds value in relation to previous and ongoing projects within the environment.

Appendix 2. Project plan

Maximum 5 pages (including any references). Page numbered. To be uploaded under *Appendix 2. Project plan*.

- Describe the objectives of the project.
- Briefly describe the academic environment/business actor that the applicant research and education environment intends to establish or deepen collaboration with, and justify why the collaboration is of strategic importance to the applicant environment.¹¹
- Describe the intended person's competence and justify why it is relevant to the project. Also describe how the project is expected to contribute to new perspectives in the scientific direction of the environment.
- Describe the intended person's network, contacts, and opportunities for collaboration that may benefit the participating partners.
- Account for the employment/appointment, including employment period, employment rate, and the work tasks involved, as well as how these are to be planned over time in relation to the project's objectives.
- Account for the periods during which the person will be visiting the host organisation.
- For employment forms that refers to employment/appointment at the applicant university¹², present how the recruitment and employment/appointment will take place in relation to the appointments procedure of the applicant university.
- Account for the support that will be available around the intended person and present the practical and organisational conditions for the project (including any access to infrastructure and other relevant resources).
- Describe preliminary plans for building a long-term collaboration between participating partners that extends beyond the current project.
- For all employment forms, present how the project relates to the needs of participating partners. Also present how the project is expected to lead to benefits to participating partners and benefits to a wider business sector.
- Describe and justify the costs included in the budget table so that it is clear what the budget items consist of and how they relate to the project objectives and planned activities.

Appendix 3. Project participants

Appendix 4. Qualifications

Maximum 2 page per person. To be uploaded under *Other appendices*.

Attach CVs for all individuals who are crucial for the implementation of the project.

The Foundation applies a broadened review of academic merits (more information on [the Foundation's website](#)¹⁴). Thus, all academically active participants should present a selection of the merits and experiences that are most relevant to the project and the programme form. *For example*, emanate from the following categories:

- **Education and degrees**
- **Employment and assignments**
- **Research output:** select at most ten (10) research results/outputs. In addition to scientific publications, this could be for example: documented artistic merits, instrumental or product development, data set, software, patent, process or policy development, as well as implementation of research results.
- **Teaching:** pedagogical qualification including, for example, teaching, training and supervision, education development including development of open teaching resources and learning objects (learning and teaching materials).
- **Cooperation:** with academia, business sector, or other societal actors, as well as communication efforts.
- **Management:** project management, organisational development, assessment assignments, centre management, department assignments, granted funding.

Appendix 5. Letters of intent

Approximately 1 page per partner. To be uploaded under *Other appendices*.

Signed letter of intent from each of the participating partners must be attached. Each letter of intent must include

- expected results and benefits of the participation
- contributions and participation in the implementation of the project
- ability to contribute in accordance with the project plan and budget¹⁵.

Letters of intent should either be signed manually or electronically by, for example, GetAccept, ebox, or similar systems.

Appendix 6. Signatures from the university

Appendix template for signatures is downloaded from [the Foundation's website](#)¹⁶. To be uploaded under *Other appendices*.

The application must be signed by the project manager and the project owner. The project manager's signature implies responsibility for the described implementation. The project owner assures through his/her signature that the university approves the project and will be involved according to the project description. The project owner should have the right of delegation to conclude agreements with the Knowledge Foundation.

The signature appendix should either be signed manually or electronically by, for example, eduSign, GetAccept, ebox, or similar systems.

Preparation and assessment

The application will be reviewed by the secretariat of the Knowledge Foundation to ensure that the formal requirements are met. If these are met, an external assessment panel will conduct an overall assessment based on the assessment criteria below. Funding decisions are made by the Foundation's CEO after recommendation by the external assessment panel.

Formal requirements

The following requirements must be met for the application to be considered for evaluation by the Knowledge Foundation. Applications that do not meet the requirements, will be rejected for formal reasons.

- The applicant university must belong to the Knowledge Foundation's target group.
- The project manager must have a doctoral degree and be employed by the university at the latest at the start of the project.
- The intended person for employment as an international guest researcher must have a doctoral degree, be employed by a university outside Sweden, hold an employment at least equivalent to the level of senior lecturer, and must not previously have been affiliated, employed, or otherwise engaged at the applicant university.
- The application must include appendices according to the call instructions.
- At least one external partner must co-finance or participate in the project (read more under *Participation of the business sector and other partners*).
- Co-financing must be in accordance with the instructions in the call text (read more under *Financial framework and budgeting*).
- Co-financing business actors must fulfil the criteria set by the Knowledge Foundation.¹⁷
- Signed letters of intent from all participating partners must be attached.
- Employment period and employment rate must follow the instructions of the call (read more under *Project design*).
- Adjunct professor/senior lecturer may not be from or to companies of sole proprietorship.
- Funds requested from the Knowledge Foundation must follow the instructions of the call (read more under *Project design* and *Financial framework and budgeting*).
- Funds requested from the Knowledge Foundation cannot be used for teaching activities at undergraduate level (first cycle).
- For applications submitted no later than 13 October 2026: Projects may start no earlier than 1 February 2027, and no later than 1 February 2028.
- For applications submitted no later than 28 January 2027: Projects may start no earlier than 1 August 2027, and no later than 1 August 2028.
- The application must be signed by the project owner and the project manager.

Assessment criteria

Contribution to the development of the research and education environment

- To what extent are there clear and relevant descriptions of the current state of the research and education environment, as well as its ambitions and objectives for strengthening the environment?
- How well justified is the project's contribution to the desired development of the research and education environment in the short and long term?

Scientific quality¹⁸

- To what extent is the intended person's competence considered relevant to the project?
- To what extent is the project expected to contribute to new perspectives in the scientific direction of the environment?

Benefit to the business sector

- How relevant is the project to the needs of the participating partners?
- To what extent is the project expected to contribute to the benefit of a wider business sector?

Implementation

- To what extent is the implementation plan, including work tasks and time plan, adequate and realistic in relation to the objectives of the project?
- To what extent is the project designed to lead to a long-term collaboration between participating partners?
- To what extent does the university provide adequate support, and to what extent has the university established appropriate practical and organisational conditions for the implementation of the project?
- How well is the budget described and justified in the project plan? To what extent is the amount requested from the Foundation reasonable in relation to the project design?
